Types of Trademark

Trademarks are used to protect distinctive signs that identify and distinguish goods or services in the marketplace. Here is a list of common types of trademarks:

9. **Certification Marks:** Certification marks are used to indicate that goods or services meet certain standards or qualifications. Examples include the "ISO 9001" mark or the "Organic" mark.
